Welcome to Sydney Chamber Choir's 2023 season. We are excited to offer you a year in sound that traverses the majestic and the intimate, the uplifting and the challenging, the energetic and the reflective.

We open with **Splendour & Mystery** which combines the works of Gabrieli and Schütz, written for the enormous acoustics of European cathedrals, with works by Clare Maclean and Brooke Shelley that reflect on this choral heritage. This program is also a rare chance to hear the Mass for Double Choir by Swiss composer Frank Martin. I have been entranced by the mystery and the yearning in this piece since I first heard it as a student and am looking forward to delving into its magic with the choir.

As the days grow shorter and colder in June, we return to The Neilson at Pier 2/3 at Walsh Bay to present an intimate experience – just twenty-four singers will treat you to an evening wrapped up in music for the night. I'm delighted to be joined by singer and arranger Naomi Crellin to co-direct this performance, **Winter Nights**, which has music by Debussy, Poulenc, Ravel and Whitacre as well as songs from the greats: Jacques Brel and Edith Piaf.

Commissioning and performing new music is Sydney Chamber Choir's bread and butter. In 2021 we premiered Joe Twist's *An Australian Song Cycle*, which charts a journey through our landscape with the help of some of our nation's greatest poets. Joe's piece received such a strong reception that it only seems right that we hear it again. Our third concert, **The Human Spirit**, pairs this cycle with music of profound beauty from the Baltic tradition and, continuing the spirit of new music, a premiere of a commissioned work by Elizabeth Younan.

Music offers us a way to give voice to our innermost thoughts and feelings. We enjoy sharing this experience with you and invite you to join us for a year of beauty in sound.

Sam Allchurch Artistic Director

Sam Allchurch has been Artistic Director of Sydney Chamber Choir since 2019. Since then, he has established a strong relationship with the choir and its audiences, directing the choir in a wide range of concerts and collaborations.

Sam's programs champion the music of Australian composers such as Brenda Gifford, Clare Maclean, Paul Stanhope and Joe Twist. In 2022, he conducted the premiere of new works by Ella Macens and Brooke Shelley and made studio recordings of Stanhope's *Requiem* and Heather Percy's *Three Night Songs*. Other recent highlights with the choir include Handel's *Messiah* in 2020, *Cycles* for the 2021 Sydney Festival and the premiere of Twist's *An Australian Song Cycle* in 2021.

Sam is also Director of Music at Christ Church St Laurence, where he conducts the choir which dates back to 1845. This choir sings music of the Anglican choral tradition within the services offered each week at this historic church. Sam is also Associate Artistic Director at Gondwana Choirs, where he has prepared choirs for the Sydney Symphony Orchestra and Opera Australia and played a key role in presenting the Gondwana World Choral Festival.

Sam holds a Bachelor of Music from the University of Melbourne, where he was a choral scholar at Trinity College. Sam was awarded a Gates Scholarship to complete a Master in Music (Choral Studies) at the University of Cambridge where he studied with Stephen Layton.



We are passionate about choral music and its unique ability to celebrate and reflect upon the stories of our past, present and future.

We love to travel deep inside the music to meet the composers and bring their vision alive in sound. We reach back to explore the masterpieces of the Baroque and the Renaissance, while also championing the music of our own time and place, regularly commissioning works by established and emerging Australian composers.

Formed in 1975, we have been honoured to work with guest conductors such as Carl Crossin, Roland Peelman, Elizabeth Scott and Brett Weymark, as well as our three previous directors, Nicholas Routley, Paul Stanhope and the late Richard Gill AO.

We collaborate with leading Australian instrumentalists, ensembles and singers, including the Australian Haydn Ensemble, the Australian Romantic & Classical Orchestra, Andrew Goodwin, David Greco, Slava Grigoryan, Orchestra of the Antipodes, Synergy Percussion, Joseph Tawadros and The Muffat Collective. We also enjoy more unconventional partnerships, including concerts with the Hilltop Hoods, The Idea of North and the Sydney Mardi Gras Community Choir.

The choir appeared at the Sydney Festival in 2021 and the Canberra International Music Festival in 2022, and we tour regularly in regional NSW, most recently to Goulburn for the Hume Chamber Music Festival. We have sung in Hong Kong, Taiwan and the UK, and in 2009 the choir was a prizewinner in the Tolosa International Choral Competition in Spain.

Our performances have been broadcast across the country on ABC Classic and on 2MBS Fine Music Sydney, and our CD recordings are available on the ABC Classic and Tall Poppies labels.
